#### SIZE

1 Ensure every prospective tenant (including family members and friends) fills in a questionnaire to determine their employment history, credit commitments and who they have rented from in the past. Be wary of those who are reluctant to do so, regardless of how well you think you know them.

2 Don't allow yourself to be rushed into making a decision. Check all references, do a credit check and speak to previous landlords before handing over the keys. Listen to what previous landlords have to say and avoid a tenant if the landlord hesitates when asked if they would lease a property to that particular person again.

3) Don't be fooled by those who are willing to pay a substantial amount up front because this in no way guarantees that you will receive payment once the rent becomes due. Bank statements should always be checked to ensure the tenant can afford to rent the home and will be able to pay the rent going forward.

4 Unscrupulous tenants will often go all out to impress a potential landlord and may well offer to pay the deposit before all the relevant checks have been done. Be careful of those who flash the cash and certainly don't forgo any checks simply because the tenant seemingly has enough money for the rent.

**5** Trust your gut instinct and don't rent to someone who makes you feel uncomfortable or intimidated.

6 Avoid those who question or attempt to flout your rules before they even move in. No pets means no pets, regardless of how well behaved the animal appears to be.

Be alert to signs of drug or alcohol abuse. This is often easier said than done, but don't rent to someone who appears intoxicated or under the influence of drugs every time you meet.

8 Be careful about renting to a person who has a history of moving frequently. Tenants tend to move far more than homeowners, but a person who regularly changes addresses should be investigated further to ascertain why.

 Check the employment history carefully and avoid those who seemingly flit from job to job.

① Avoid a tenant who attempts to negotiate the rental or has a past history of paying late.

11 Consider renting your home to someone else if the prospective tenant starts finding fault with the property from the moment they walk through the door.

12 Be careful if they want to pay the deposit after they've moved in, or offer to pay the deposit off over a period of time.

13 Be cautious when renting to the self-employed, particularly if they have only recently started working for themselves. Cash flow can be a very real problem in a new business venture.

13 Be wary of those who only provide family members as references or those who are unable to provide contact details for their references. Do not accept written references at face value, call and speak to the listed person.

While there's no doubt that some landlords have the ability to make a tenant's life miserable, it's unlikely that every landlord who has ever rented property to your prospective tenant has been unreasonable. There's generally good reason why a landlord has booted a tenant out of their property and it's advisable to avoid these tenants like the plague.

## LIBRARY BOOK DONATIONS



We are very grateful for the perennial summer rains which bring some kind of magic to the gardens, have a look around the estate and witness the mystical ethereal green of spring! Enjoy all your beautiful gardens at this special time before the high summer temperatures!

Whilst we are appreciative of the perennial rain, it does cause some havoc with cleaning of the river – we do have to take the team off the gardens for a whole day once a week, to clean the river, which is a mammoth, monstrous task. However, that is working with mother nature and we thank you all for your understanding and patience in this regard.

## **PLANT AND SOW NOW**

For instant colour, go for calibrachoas with masses of miniature petunia-like flowers.

Go-getter perennials for all regions are: Agapanthus, gauras, nemesias, osteospermums and geraniums of all kinds. Also go for gypsophila and masses of pretty but tough angelonias. Star jasmine, penstemons, columbines and echinaceas are lovely too.

Top seedling tip: Give your seedlings the best head start in life by planting them in compostenriched soil. When transplanting, avoid pulling them out by their stems and rather push them out from the bottom of the punnet. Pinch out their growth tips as they mature for a bushier plant.

**Top sowing tip:** To prevent small seeds from sticking to your fingers and clumping together, mix them with some dry sand, then sprinkle over moist soil.



- Lawns: Fix hollows and bumps by cutting out the turf in the affected area. Add or reduce soil as needed and gently replace the turf, in shady areas with barren patches. Spray weedkiller to get rid of broadleaf weeds. Before treatment, fertilise your lawn and water well, wait two weeks before applying spray.
- Weed alert: Weeds compete with healthy crops for space, water, sunlight and nutrients, ultimately reducing your crop yield. They grow quickly and reproduce in large numbers. Seeds are easily dispersed by wind and animals, especially whilst mowing the lawn. Weeds are also hosts for pests and plant diseases.
- Succulents: Tidy up succulents like echeverias and Kalanchoe thyrsiflora, which have stopped flowering. Divide and replant into other parts of the garden.
- Pests: Put out snail taps and cutworm bait to protect all new seedlings.
- Anti-fungal: Encourage strong root systems and combat fungal disease by watering your garden early in the morning.

No small colour swatches will be accepted at the estate office for approval. This new process is required as the small swatches are often very deceiving. To avoid unnecessary expenses and as per our estate and architectural rules, please ensure your earthy colours and the process required are approved by the DVHA before painting commences.

Thank you to all residents who have completed painting of homes this winter, they look stunning and in keeping with the high standard required in the Valley.



We remind residents to please submit plans to the estate office for approval by our estate architect before any renovations begin. The plan scrutiny fee is R2 250.
