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# CELEBRATING OUR ENVIRONMENT

one commemorative day at a time

**N**estled in the heart of our modern urban landscape, Waterfall City strives to be a beacon of sustainable living, aligning its development focus with strong environmental stewardship. To bring the public's attention to this, Waterfall City aims to highlight some of its ground-breaking initiatives in line with several international commemorative days celebrating the environment.

We kick these celebrations off in February by highlighting World Wetlands Day (2 February). As the name suggests, this day is designed to raise awareness and action for wetland protection. There is reason to argue that wetlands are ecological powerhouses. They are critical hubs of biodiversity, performing water purification functions while effectively controlling floods and carbon sequestration.

These distinct ecosystems in Waterfall City's context form part of the last lingering vestiges of wetlands of the Egoli Granite grasslands, a degraded and transformed biome within the greater Gauteng province, thus necessitating rehabilitation as part of the overall developmental activities.

As a result, Waterfall City is committed to maintaining and enhancing its natural assets. Ruan Spies, the Environmental Manager at Waterfall City Management Company, says, "A perfect opportunity presented itself that highlights this and we hope our residents will appreciate the efforts made to responsibly manage open spaces - a rare feature in today's City living."

The western part of the Kikuyu residential estate, near Old Pretoria Road, faced



several challenges brought on by significant stormwater coupled with the area's highly erodible sandy soils, which was further compounded by substantial infestations of invasive plant species that disrupted the wetland's natural ecosystem.

"To overcome this, we worked together with Balwin Properties to determine the most cost-effective rehabilitation methods. Of course, this meant we had to be quite creative in some instances for a solution that would underpin sustainability," says Spies.

We concluded that a combined approach of engineering acumen and using available natural resources on site would be the best course of action. The engineering consisted of gabions, designed to protect the main bridge crossing with rocks to act as a sediment basin where excessive silt is prevented from entering the dam. Excessive silt degrades water quality and negatively impacts aquatic life.

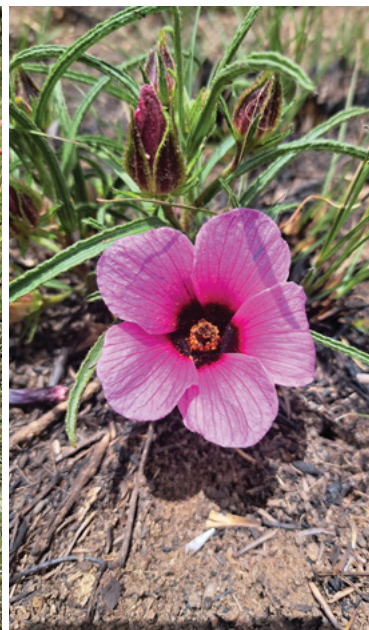
Care had to be taken when it came to invasive tree management. While they undeniably threaten natural resources, their roots did serve a purpose in holding some of the embankments together. Thus, we decided against uprooting the trees in favour of systematic and slower eradication methods, such as cutting and treating the various tree stumps

*This is a naturally made dissipation and attenuation structure. It will slow down the water coming in from the top grate and allow for the deposition of silt and plant debris thereby allowing for other plants to take hold and lessen the deep channelling taking place.*







*These two pictures depict the engineered solution which was required to prevent scouring under the bridge. This consisted of reinforcing the embankments with gabions including a fairly large dissipation structure just before the inlet of the dam. This will allow for any excess silt to be caught and cleaned prior to entering the dam.*



to prevent regrowth. Furthermore, the logistics of removing and disposing of massive amounts of plant debris presented additional costs, and it still left erosion concerns in the upper section of the channel.

“We decided that the best course of action was to repurpose invasive trees as natural building materials. These were used to create a network of lattice fences to protect the embankments from erosion at critical junctures,” adds Spies.

In addition to stabilising the embankments, these wooden fences contribute to the general aesthetics of the wetland by having a more natural look and feel.

“I would like to commend the Balwin Properties team for their efforts. We are glad to have played a small but critical part in rehabilitating the wetlands. As we celebrate World Wetlands Day, this was a project to profile,” says Spies.

As we look forward to other significant environmental days, Waterfall City continues blazing a trail in sustainable urban living. 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# HARNESSING SOLAR POWER FOR ECO-FRIENDLY IRRIGATION



**B**uilt according to sustainable principles and practices, Waterfall City has recently completed a new project that further underscores its commitment to environmental stewardship. The Waterfall Common Services Company (WCSC) has installed a solar system at Gate 6 of Waterfall Country Estate to be used exclusively to power the irrigation plant also located there. This heralds a significant jump towards green energy and mitigating the ongoing scourge of load shedding.

The plant provides irrigation water to several other estates in Waterfall City and the entirety of Waterfall Drive and Polofields Drive. Managed by WCSC, the irrigation plant maintains the lush, indigenous landscapes characterising the area.

Thys Redelinghuys, General Manager of WCSC, highlights the critical role of this solar system: “Thanks to the solar installation for the irrigation plant, we can now more effectively irrigate during the hot dry months following winter, while being completely unaffected by load shedding. This means we no longer need to take on additional expenses such as getting water tankers and can guarantee that our gardens stay green while also ensuring the long-term health of the irrigation plant.”

The irrigation plant, which can pump two million litres daily during peak times, is one of the cornerstones of Waterfall City’s green environment. The new solar installation boasts a 120Kw maximum capacity per hour and provides Waterfall City with an effective solution for maintaining irrigation during load shedding.





“We generate about 70Kw per hour on average while the sun shines, using 144 solar panels. The plant will generate sufficient power to run all our irrigation equipment during sunshine hours. Irrigating at night, a necessity due to the irrigation demand, and to minimise evaporation, is now more feasible and efficient. The solar system, equipped with battery packs, ensures that the irrigation can continue even during the typical 2½ hours of potential load shedding at night,” explains Redelinghuys.

This initiative aligns with Waterfall City’s sustainability focus of creating a green environment that is good for the residents and the planet. The city’s commitment to eco-friendly practices is evident in its 31 green-rated buildings, rainwater harvesting systems, and the extensive use of

solar power, notably at Mall of Africa. This new solar system at Gate 6 extends this commitment, significantly reducing reliance on coal-fired power from Eskom and saving substantial CO2 emissions.

“We anticipate the solar installation will pay for itself in the next four years. This will be a cost-benefit: We will be able to control the cost of water much better with this plant, unlike when we were fully reliant on Eskom,” Redelinghuys adds.

This initiative benefits the immediate area by ensuring the health and sustainability of its landscapes and highlights the effectiveness of using renewable energy in building sustainable communities.



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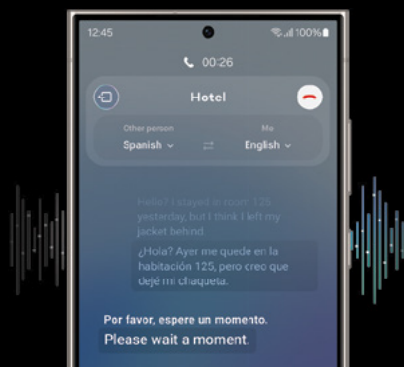
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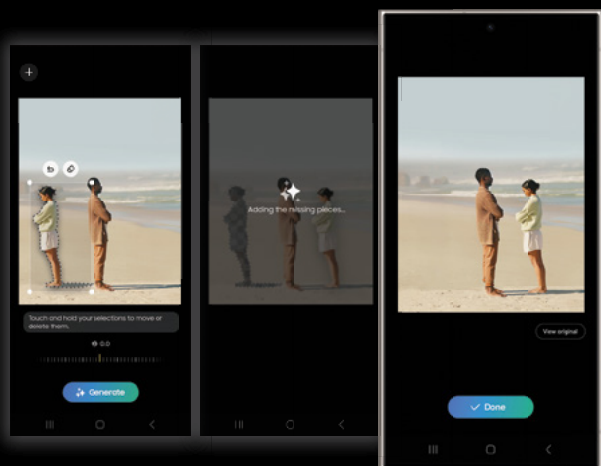

# HEALTHY LUNCHES FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

**A**re you constantly reaching for your phone to order fast food for lunch because you ran out of time in the morning? Maybe you are avoiding packing a healthy lunch because you have no idea where to start or what 'healthy' even means. Or perhaps you are an extremely busy mom, sending the kiddies to school with money to buy something at the school's tuck shop. There is nothing wrong with having the odd takeaway or tuck shop meal now and then, but generally, it is healthier and much more cost-effective to pack your own lunch.

Here are some simple tips and tricks on how to pack a healthy lunch for the whole family:

### **Choose a starch:**

Try to choose a starch that is high in fibre and has a low glycaemic index. Fibre will keep you fuller for longer and can help prevent constipation. Think along the lines of whole wheat bread, wraps, pasta, or couscous. Quinoa is another great option.

### **Choose a protein:**

Protein will help keep you feeling satisfied and is important to build muscle in the body. Choose fish like tuna, sardines or salmon. Eggs, low-fat cottage cheese, or nut butter are all healthy proteins. Don't forget about pulses like chickpeas, beans or lentils. They are a source of fibre and low in fat. You can even use the leftover meat from the night before.

### **Choose a low-carb vegetable:**

Adding low-carb vegetables will ensure you get extra vitamins, minerals, and antioxidants to help support your immune system. Try leafy greens, carrot sticks, cherry tomatoes or chunky vegetable soup in the winter.

### **Choose a healthy fat:**

Choose fats like reduced-fat salad dressing, or sauces. Avocado and olives are another heart-healthy option to add to your lunch.

### **Add a healthy snack:**

Have at least three meals a day and two healthy snacks. This will help regulate your blood sugar levels throughout the day and may even prevent cravings. A handful of nuts, fruit, low-fat yoghurt, homemade popcorn, and whole-grain crackers with nut butter or cheese can be a great addition to your lunch box. Think outside the box by adding hummus with vegetable sticks.

### **Hydration:**

It is essential to drink enough water throughout the day to stay hydrated. Add lemon, mint, or cucumber slices to flavour. Juices or sugary drinks can add unnecessary calories, making maintaining a healthy body weight difficult. In summer, freeze your drink to keep everything else cool.

Some lunchbox ideas to get you started:

- **For the kiddies going to school:** Whole-wheat chicken-mayo wrap filled with lettuce and cucumber.
- **For the busy mom:** Chickpea and quinoa salad with finely chopped red peppers and cucumber. Add a reduced-fat salad dressing of your choice.
- **For those working from home:** Whole-wheat toast with salmon and avocado with vegetable sticks on the side.

It is important to plan your meals for the week ahead and to ensure you have all the ingredients in your pantry and fridge to make those delicious lunch meals. In times when markets are volatile, it is natural to feel nervous, but with the right support and knowledge,



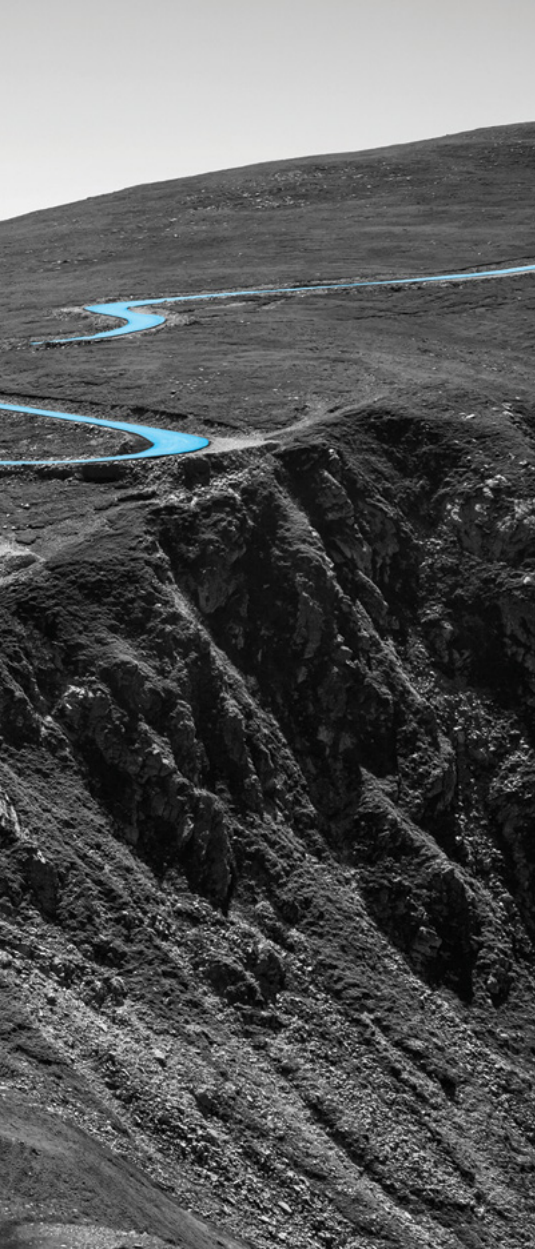

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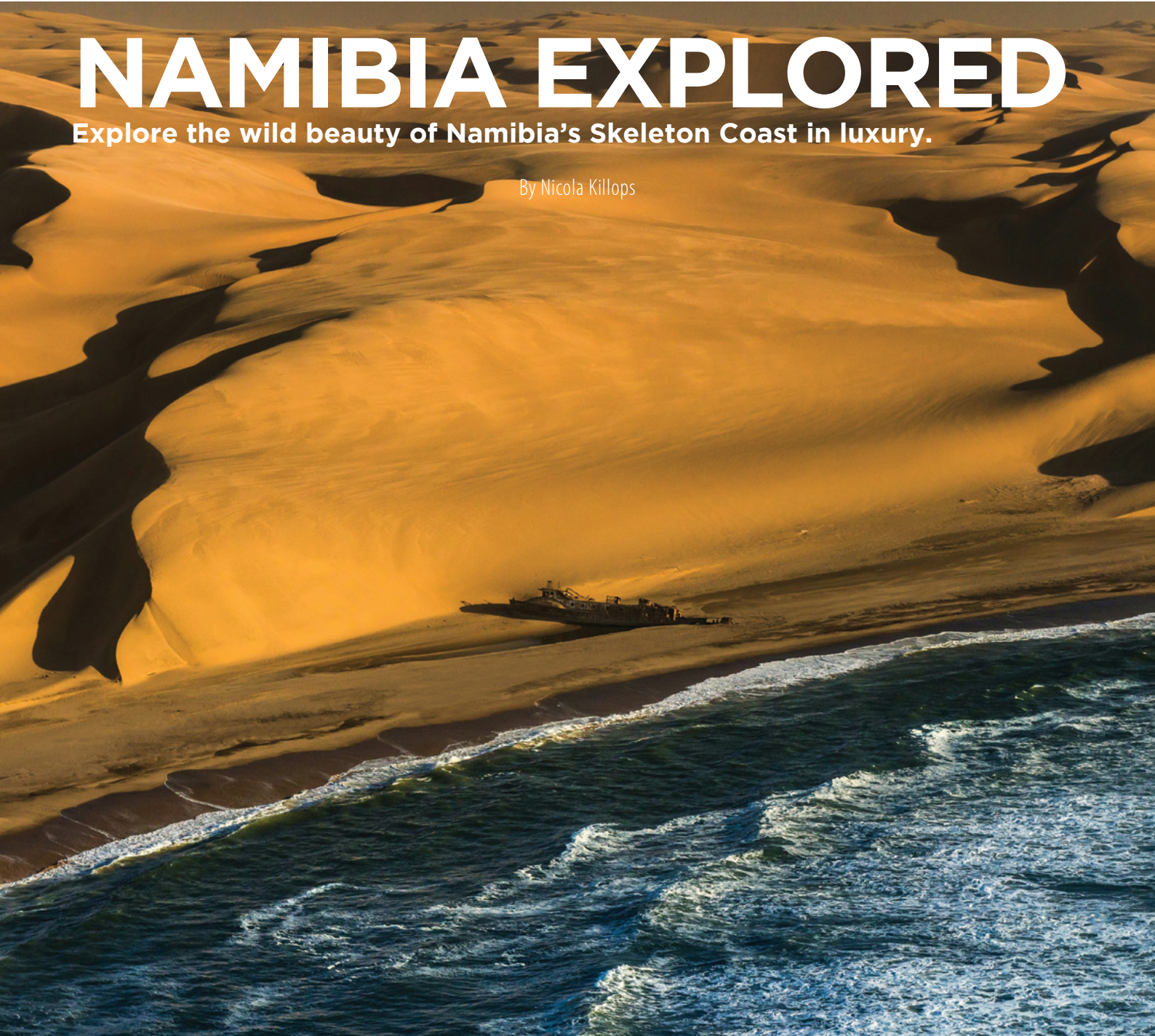
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# NAMIBIA EXPLORED

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## Educating Neurodiverse Children:

# HELPING THEM BE SEEN AND HEARD

**A**s a school principal, I'm lucky to have been part of the many transformative journeys our students and their families have gone through. Every journey is different – as is every child – but as two remarkable mothers recently highlighted during an EduThink Podcast, we are doing our children a disservice if we don't learn to understand and ultimately embrace their differences.

Jo Judnick Wilson and Nicola Killops are both parents to neurodiverse sons. Nicola's son is 19 and was diagnosed with autism at age 7. Jo's son is 13 and was diagnosed at 4.

Jo and Nicola have both faced challenges finding schools that cater to their son's needs and for me, this underscores the importance of

embracing neurodiversity in education. There is no one-size-fits-all approach. Some children learn differently, and we owe it to them to nurture that rather than exclude them because of it.

Nicola touches on her journey with James: "James is what they call 'Twice Exceptional' or '2E' – intellectually gifted, with dyslexia and high-functioning autism. Early on, I noticed he was different, struggling with sleep and speech delays.

"His journey through various schools, including a remedial school and a specialised dyslexia programme (The Davis Programme), eventually led him to Orion College. Unfortunately, he outgrew it and went through two more schools before finally settling in the right environment (nine schools in total). But despite the challenges, he's

grown into a strapping, bright young man, thriving under Gershom's care and wisdom."

Says Jo, "When our son arrived, signs of sensory issues emerged around two-and-a-half years. Meltdowns and intensified sensory challenges followed. After joining support groups and seeking professional advice, our son was diagnosed with autism around age 4.

"We faced conflicts about mainstream versus remedial education, and the journey included homeschooling during the pandemic. Eventually, we found a supportive environment at Education Incorporated, where he felt comfortable and chose to stay back a year for his wellbeing."

My conversation with Nicola and Jo highlighted how crucial it is for every

child to be seen – to be respected – not despite who they are, but because of it. Nicola explains, “Don’t underestimate your child. If you start with a mindset that your child is incapable, that’s exactly what they will be. I have had teachers who have said James is incapable, and this was often when the child was sitting in the room listening. I always tell my son, ‘Whatever it is, it’s not your fault. It’s the teacher who doesn’t understand you.’”

“If somebody isn’t getting it, it’s not you. It’s them. Always believe in your child. If you believe in them and show them – teach them that they’re capable – you’re going to create somebody who is very resilient and motivated and will ultimately surprise you and many others.”

Jo adds, “You begin life with expectations – like you’re going to get married, have kids – and it’s all in this perfect little box. Then life really hits you, and it turns out messy. But the messy parts are the beautiful parts. Messy is where you grow and learn, and change is inevitable.

“I was recently asked in an interview who I look up to. I responded that, quite literally, I don’t look up; I look down because I’m taller than him. I look up to my son because he has taught me so much.”

As social entrepreneur Vivienne Schultz said, “We are all under construction,” but we need the right building blocks to progress with our journeys. As educators and parents, it falls to us to give our children the bricks and mortar they need to build themselves up.

Jo and Nicola acknowledge there is no single recipe for success, given each child’s uniqueness. While neurodiverse children can face challenges in life, in school and social situations, parents and educators can help them overcome barriers and thrive.

Many neurodiverse people have made a profound impact on the world. Director Tim Burton, tech pioneer

Steve Jobs and fellow Silicon Valley billionaire Bill Gates, are among the neurodivergent changemakers who have achieved success far beyond anything most ‘normal’ people ever will.

Being different should be a source of pride, never shame. As Nicola and Jo have proved, with early intervention, consistent therapy, being a tireless advocate for your child, finding other parents to connect with, and having no expectations except giving your child the tools they need to become the person they want to be, they can become functional, highly successful human beings – and it is our privilege to educate them.

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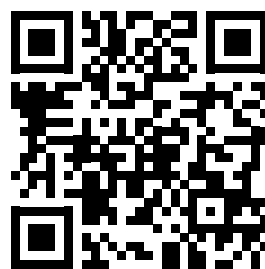

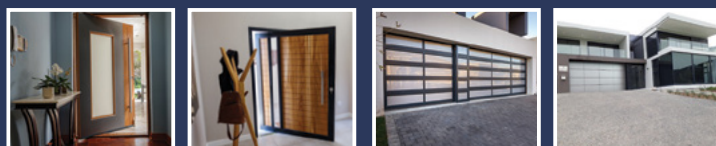
