port is one thing that unites all South Africans, and with spring finally underway we're surrounded by sporting opportunities.

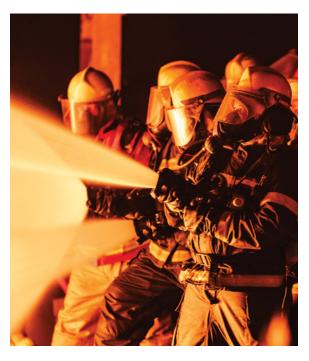

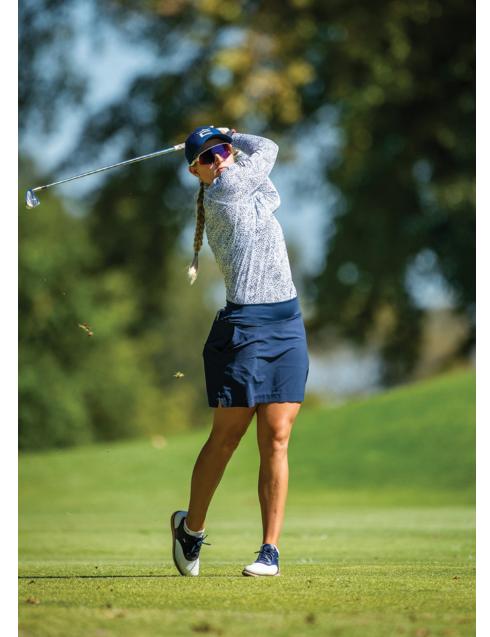
Waterfall City is excited to grow alongside Casandra and support her journey as she aims for new heights in her professional career.

"I am so excited about this partnership with WCMC and think it is going to be

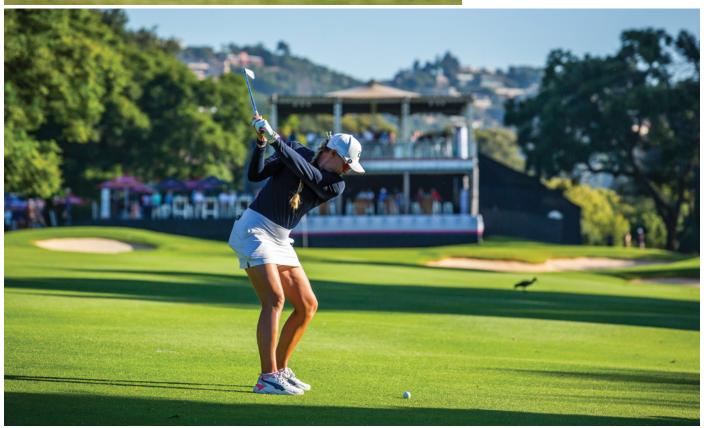

#### Q: What is the restaurant and cuisine?

**A:** Jinsei, serving Japanese, Korean and Vietnamese cuisine.

#### Q: When did you decide to become a chef, and why?

**A:** I have always had a passion for food, so in 2009 I decided to make it my career.

#### Q: Did you study?

**A:** Yes, I studied at the Fine Dining Chef Academy in Zimbabwe.

#### Q: Do you have any accolades?

A: Not yet.

#### Q: What is your cooking style?

A: Traditional Asian with a twist.

#### Q: What is your inspiration for new recipes/dishes?

**A:** Cookbooks, cooking shows and Pinterest.

### Q: What is your favourite dish to prepare on your current menu and why?

**A:** Definitely the Chicken and Prawn Pad Thai Wok Bowl, because it has just about all the flavours, from salty and sour, to sweet and even a bit fermented.

#### Q: What is your favourite home-cooked meal?

**A:** It's a toss-up between beef and pasta or pap and cow heels (cow trotter stew).

## Q: In your opinion, what is the most underrated ingredient and why?

**A:** Ginger. Not one of the restaurants where I have previously worked used ginger, as they thought it made the food bitter and overpowered the dish. When used correctly, it is the most amazing ingredient.

## Q: If you could cook with only three ingredients, what would they be?

**A:** Black pepper, brandy, and cream to make a pepper brandy sauce.



Q: What is one kitchen tool or appliance you cannot function without?

**A:** A good set of knives.

Q: If money were no object, what kitchen appliances would you invest in?

**A:** A steamer, blender and food processor.

#### Q: Who is your chef idol? Why?

**A:** Gordon Ramsay, because he is incredibly inspiring and fantastic.

## Q: If you could prepare a meal for one celebrity, who would it be, and what would you serve?

**A:** I would make a Salmon Poke Bowl for Sadio Mané, the famous Senegalese footballer.

## Q: What do you think of cooking shows? Do you have a favourite?

**A:** Cooking shows expose chefs to a variety of dishes and techniques, helping us gain more experience. My favourite is *Hell's Kitchen* with Gordon Ramsay.

### Q: What is your favourite South African dish to eat? A: Mogodu (tripe) and pap.

#### Q: What will we always find in your fridge?

A: Gyoza (Japanese dumplings).

#### Q: If you could choose your last meal, what would it be?

**A:** Jinsei's Swordfish Makimono finished with goldleaf. The combination of the miso swordfish, poached prawn and hoisin mushroom medley with the bang bang mayo, miso dressing and pineapple salsa is just so decadent.

### Q: What fast food is your secret indulgence?

A: Roast potato chips.

Q: Pro or anti air fryers? A: Pro.

#### Q: If you weren't a chef, what would you be?

**A:** A carpenter.

#### Q: Any advice you would like to share with budding chefs?

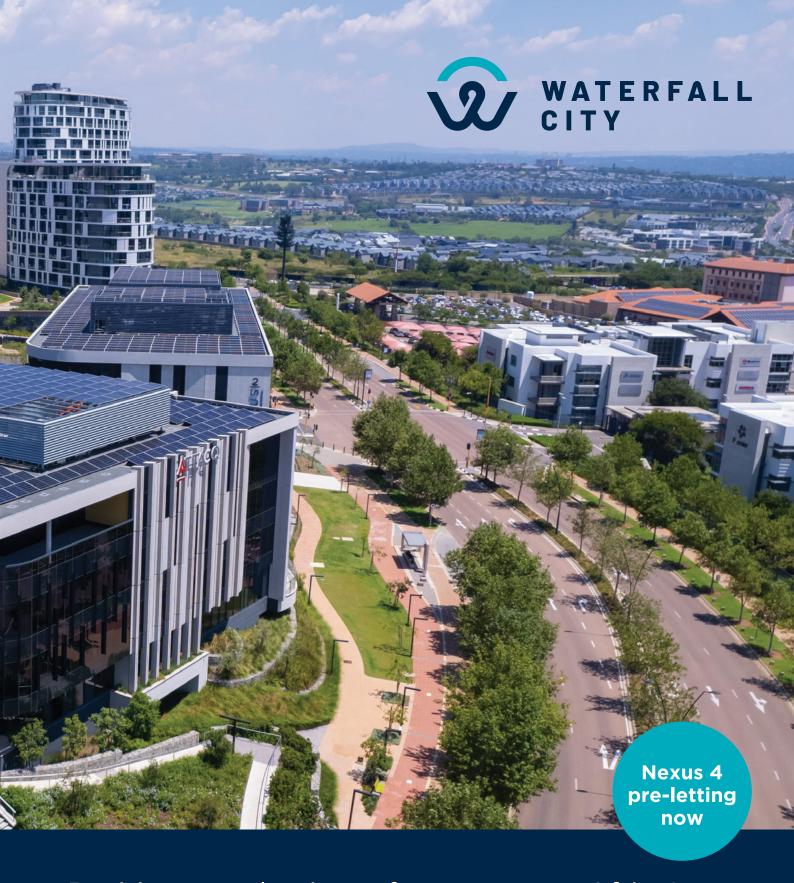

Named Junior Grand Champion of the World





ollowing a successful 2023, the Waterfall City dance team, trained at the Pulse Dance Studio in Waterfall Country Village and led by dance coach Corlanie Botha, has had nothing short of a fantastic 2024 so far, attaining more medals and achieving great accolades on an international level.

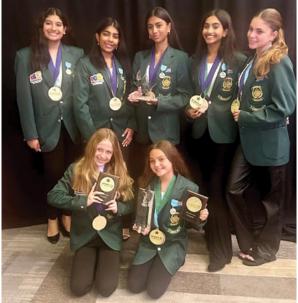
#### **Outstanding achievements**

After competing in the hip hop/street dance category at the South African Championships of the Performing Arts in October 2023, where they won Gold and the Grand Champion Award at the provincial event, the dancers from the Waterfall City dance team were once again chosen for Team South Africa to represent the country in Los Angeles at the World Championship of Performing Arts, held from 26 June to 8 July 2024.

This is the fifth time the Waterfall City dance team has competed at this international competition, and they can certainly be proud of their achievements. Seven dancers participated, performing three routines. They won two gold medals and a silver medal in the junior hip hop, open and musical categories. Over and above these, the team attained the Best Dance Group Award, the Division Champion Award, and one of the event's most prestigious awards, the Junior Grand Champion of the World, meaning that the team was the best performers across the junior competition segment.

"Taking the Waterfall City dance team to the World Championship of Performing Arts competition again was a great privilege. It is always met with excitement and nerves. I am so











proud of the team's performance and achievements on this international stage, holding South Africa's name high. This is the first time the Waterfall City dance team has achieved Junior Grand Champion of the World status. It was certainly a moment to remember, being the highest accolade that my studio has ever accomplished." says Corlanie.

#### Disney, here they come

The team's next international trip will be in December this year when 51 dancers will travel to Disney World with Pulse Dance Studio's sister company, Dance Connection. They will perform in the parades at Disney World and at one of the prestigious theatres. They will also participate in a

workshop with a Disney cast member. After that, the team will travel to Los Angeles, where they will take classes at the Millennium Dance Complex and attend workshops with celebrity choreographers.

For the remainder of the year, the team will compete in the SA Dance School Championship 2024 in October and Dance Stars in November, where they could qualify to go to Croatia in 2025.

Pulse Dance Studio has been operating in Waterfall City for 10 years, and some dancers have been with Pulse since its beginning. Offering hip hop, modern, jazz, and contemporary dancing, the studio encourages children from ages five to 18 to join.

"Not only is dancing fun exercise, but it's a great opportunity to meet other aspiring dancers in the community. Our commitment to the performers at Pulse Dance is to support their dance aspirations and dreams by offering opportunities to perform both locally and internationally," adds Corlanie.

ire Ops SA is a private fire brigade service with a station in Waterfall City. It is primarily a firefighting service, with full-time firefighters and a fleet of emergency vehicles. It also offers fire consultations, training and equipment maintenance services.

Fire Ops' presence within Waterfall City has developed extensively since its inception and its establishment of fire services two years ago, and the team will soon be adding an additional key site of operations to further their presence in the City.

#### Peace of mind

Between September 2023 and July 2024, the Fire Ops SA team stationed in Waterfall City extinguished 25 structural fires, 86 veld fires, and 8 vehicle-related fires within the City. They also supported with 33 Special Service callouts during this period, including snake and water monitor relocations as well as flooding problems.

Over and above this, our local Fire Ops SA team recently attended to two residential fires in Waterfall Country Estate. On the morning of 4 August, a fire broke out at a home due to faulty electrics in a patio jacuzzi. Patrolling Waterfall City security guards spotted the fire and reported it to the control room. While the control room contacted Fire Ops, the astute security personnel used multiple dry chemical powder fire extinguishers to mitigate the extent of the blaze.

Fire Ops crews arrived on the scene within 9 minutes, to find the pool patio and pump engulfed in flames. Within 20 minutes the rapid intervention team had extinguished the blaze using















their ultra-high pressure (UHP) system, ensuring minimal water damage, while hand tools were used to lift the deck flooring to ensure that no fire extension had occurred.

On 10 July, a fire had started in the chimney of a wood-burning fireplace at another home in Waterfall Country Estate. It was luckily suppressed just before Fire Ops arrived on the scene. However, the crew inspected the roof to make sure the fire had not extended into the roof void and spread to the rest of the home.

#### Training remains a focus

The Fire Ops team has also spent considerable time learning where the community's needs lie, and training has always been a top priority.

"Our commitment to continuous learning ensures that we are always prepared to meet the evolving challenges of fire safety. We believe that training from within is the first port of call to delivering a safer City. Residents want to know that their

homes are protected at all times. They need to understand what causes a fire, how to identify hazards in the home, how to look out for potential fire threats, and how to use basic handheld fire equipment," explains Monique Goosen, Head of Marketing.

"With this in mind, we have developed Domestic Fire Training modules that we are now rolling out across various estates at R380 per person. This two-hour session is all it takes to feel protected."

In addition to Domestic Fire Training, Fire Ops also offers Fire Marshall, First Aid and Basic Fire Training for the commercial and industrial sectors. All are SETA Accredited and certified. For more information, contact management@fireopssa.co.za.

#### What's new?

As part of Fire Ops SA's current awareness drive across Waterfall City, teams on the ground have been hard at work to ensure businesses and estates are fully briefed on the response process in the event of

an emergency. By delivering emergency signage and Unique Positioning Number (UPN) boards to security guard houses and at reception areas at commercial properties across the City, Fire Ops is safeguarding residents and businesses even further by giving them added reporting platforms for direct communications with their respective control rooms. This awareness drive will continue across Waterfall City for the foreseeable future.

Fire Ops SA is also currently running an awareness campaign across the different malls within Waterfall City, where key staff are available to answer all your questions.

Contacting Fire Ops on their emergency number 083 622 6026, as listed on the Go Waterfall app, will give you direct access to their operators who are on standby 24-hours a day to take your call, with officers and crew ready to dispatch at a moment's notice.

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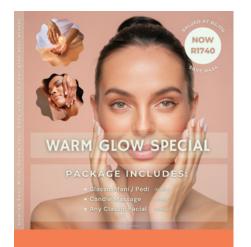

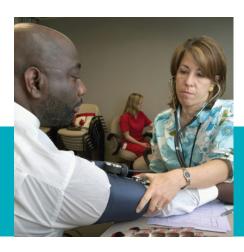

# WHAT THEY HAVE IN COMMON

hen discussing the value of the financial profession, financial advisers are often compared to medical doctors and are sometimes even called 'financial doctors'. This is because financial advisers look after clients' financial challenges in much the same way doctors look after patients' health issues. #### A detailed examination

You'd expect the doctor to ask about your medical history and that of your family, complete a thorough examination, determine the root cause of the headache and – after delivering the diagnosis and prognosis – prescribe the relevant treatment. Similarly, a financial adviser must first understand your personal circumstances and unique financial goals to determine your financial needs and how best to meet them.

The same applies to ensuring one's affairs are in order before passing away. Documenting your wishes in your will may offer some immediate relief, but





only once you have a proper estate plan in place can you have true peace of mind. Having an estate plan ensures that your executor will be able to deal with your financial obligations and assets in accordance with your wishes and in the most cost-effective way.

capital gains tax. Fortunately, these can be estimated ahead of time, and it is possible to put a plan in place to ensure that these expenses will be covered when you pass away.

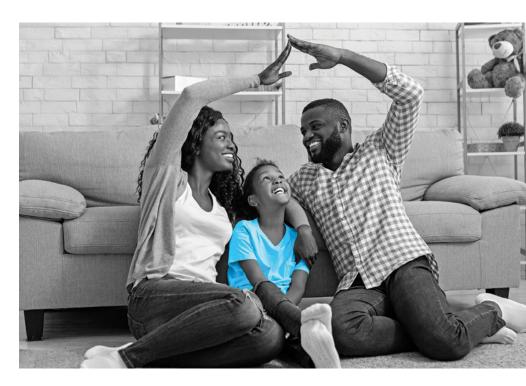
#### Don't neglect regular checkups

Wayne Blake, general manager of the resort, suggests you gather family and friends for a fabulous shisa nyama of your own. Here are Wayne's top tips for hosting the occasion with flair. He also shares his recipe for the ultimate Sheba – a spicy sauce made from onions, garlic, herbs and spices:

#### Perfect your pap

To prevent your pap from becoming stiff and dry while being served, incorporate sauces into your pap dish rather than just leaving it as is in the bowl. A good method is to make "pap balls" by submersing the pap in Sheba (see below for Wayne's ultimate Sheba recipe).

#### Bring on the flavour

Turn the traditional shisa nyama on its

head by experimenting with various flavours. Serve a snack of grilled pineapple on a skewer, sprinkled with Durban Masala. For vegetarians you can make grilled tofu skewers served with a peanut dip.

#### Variety is key

Offer a wide array of dishes but keep portions modest to encourage people to sample everything. Traditional choices usually include beef, chicken,









pork and lamb, but variations with game meats or seafood make for interesting alternatives. Complement your meat with vegetable and tofu skewers, roosterkoek, grilled sweet potato topped with ricotta cheese, garlic, rocket and spring onion, or brinjals topped with mushrooms, Brie and basil pesto.

## Take your traditional braaibroodjie to the next level

Upgrade your braaibroodjie with biltong, mature cheddar and a dash of chilli flakes or dress it up with blue cheese, fig and rocket for a gourmet twist.

#### **Keep it natural**

Avoid synthetic sauces and flavourings or heavily basted meats, and rather opt for a mixture of olive oil and salt. Or, you can add vinegar and your favourite herbs to a glass bottle – similar to Argentinian Salmuera – allowing you to baste your meat while braaiing, thereby locking in and enhancing the flavour.

#### Age matters

Choose aged meat for tenderness and

flavour. Look for 21-day aged meat from your butcher and make sure you understand the difference between dry-aged and vacuum-aged varieties as this could impact the toughness or tenderness of your meat. Chuck steak is budget-friendly and excels on the braai, offering excellent flavour without being too tough or too soft.

#### The secret to juicy chicken

For great flavour and juiciness, seal chicken in a Ziplock bag and add salt, herbs and your light marinade of choice before immersing it (bag and all) in boiling water to pre-cook. This technique locks in moisture for succulent results and enhances the flavour of the chicken.

## Mind the size of your desserts

Keep your varied dessert options small and bite-sized for easy enjoyment after a hearty meal. Examples include bite-sized malva pudding, koeksisters and milk tart. Add some variety by grilling peaches with cinnamon sugar or grilling pineapples and enjoying them with coconut ice cream.



### Here is the best Sheba recipe for your shisa nyama pap:

#### Ingredients

2-4 medium sized tomatoes, diced
Onion
Oil
Garlic
Fresh herbs, of your choice
Salt and pepper
Sugar (to balance the acidity)

#### Instructions

- 1. Heat oil in a pan and sauté the onion until translucent.
- 2. Add fresh herbs, garlic and pepper to the pan and continue cooking.
- 3. Add the tomato, salt and sugar to the pan.
- 4. Let the mixture simmer for 15 minutes to enhance the flavour.
- 5. Add to your warm pap and serve.

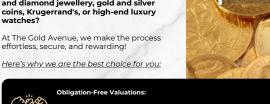




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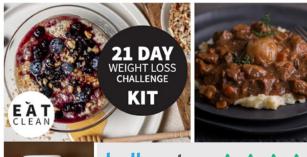


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## **CLIVIA, QUEEN OF SPRING**

Clivias are one of South Africa's indigenous super stunners and have become quite the collector's dream.

pring is well-known for the Clivia flowers that grow in abundance in shady spots.

The upcoming Clivia Flower Show that takes place on 14-15 September at Garden World Nursery, Beyers Naude Drive is an excellent example of the exquisite hybrid colours of Clivia that are available. Orange is the original dominant colour, but new hybrids come in a spectrum from red (deep orange) to all shades and combinations of peach, yellow and green, up to the palest cream.

A colour mutation is a genetic variation in a *Clivia miniate*, which can be reproduced through sexual reproduction, whereas a colour pattern is the colour distribution on a *Clivia miniata* flower.

These hybrids are the result of hand-pollinated flowers for seed production. Their large flowers make them easy to pollinate (perfect for novice plant breeders!), and the seed is large and easy to handle. The only drawback is that they are slow-growing, taking on

average three to four years to flower from seed.

You can use the pollen of the same flower to pollinate it. However, if two different plants are used, both sets of genes are mixed, resulting in a better seed set and more vigorous seedlings, which combine characteristics of each parent.

If you want to try hybridising, look for the plant/flower characteristics that appeal to you – such as colour, flower shape, number of flowers per head, leaf shape, etc. – and select your parent plants that have these. There are numerous videos available on YouTube explaining how to hand pollinate Clivia flowers.

The seeds are enclosed in a fleshy pulp and take several months to mature. Seeds can be harvested when the berries are still green. If left on the plant, the berries containing the seeds will soften and colour up red or yellow after about 10 months. They can remain on the plant for up to two years.

After picking your berries, remove the outer pulp and clean the seed by washing it in a fungicide or dishwashing liquid. Let it dry for about a week. Different growth mediums can be used – for example, two-litre plastic ice-cream containers – with the seed placed between moist paper-towelling. Keep the container in a warm spot, not in direct sunlight. The seed should germinate anywhere between five and 20 days, showing a white root but no leaves.

The germinated seeds are now ready for planting into black plastic plant bags or pots about 20cm deep. A deep bag is needed due to the excessively fast growth of the roots.

If you find the above too timeconsuming, scatter the seeds on the ground in a moist, shady place in the garden and leave to germinate.

Growing Clivias from seed is slow-going, but the results can be spectacular.

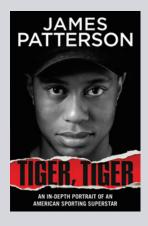

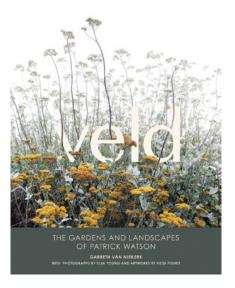

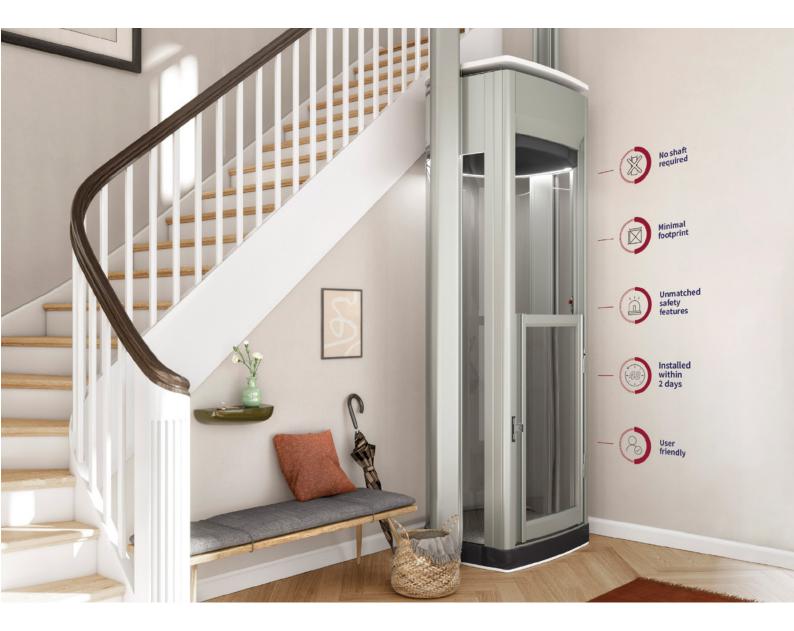
