

The Blue Wave Journey

The Waterfall City Athletics Club (WCAC) is a non-profit social running club established in 2018 by a small, passionate group of runners training in the Waterfall City (Midrand) area. What began as a few like-minded individuals running together, quickly grew into a vision: to form a club that would serve runners in Waterfall City and the surrounding communities.

With determination and heart, the founders rallied to secure the 25 members required to register the club with Central Gauteng Athletics (CGA). By January 2018, WCAC officially launched with 46 members – a significant milestone that marked the birth of what would become one of the most dynamic and fastest-growing running communities in the country.

Driven by a desire to make running accessible to all, regardless of age, race, or ability, WCAC was built on values of inclusion, support, and community. It became a space where first-time runners could join with confidence, and seasoned athletes could thrive. Fast forward seven years to 2025, the club has grown exponentially with over 1,000 members across the city. They meet every Saturday at Polofields Crossing for their flagship Saturday Run, where runners of all paces gather to train and connect. During the week, their vibrant city-wide crews meet in various locations, keeping the Blue Wave energy alive and making it easier for members to stay active close to home or work.

SUMMITTING EVEREST

8,849 metres of purpose

South African mountaineer, philanthropist, Brand SA ambassador and prospective Waterfall City resident Angela Yeung recently achieved the pinnacle of mountaineering, summiting Mount Everest from its formidable North Side on 24 May 2025. Yet, this historic feat was never solely about conquering a mountain. It was the powerful culmination of a profound mission: to empower survivors of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) through her non-profit organisation, the Impilo Collection Foundation.

Angela's symbolic target is to collect 8,849 bras – one for every metre of Everest's towering height – a tangible effort to restore dignity and show unwavering solidarity with GBV survivors across South Africa.

"Climbing Everest is a monumental challenge, but it pales in comparison to the daily battles faced by GBV survivors," Angela passionately stated. "Each bra we collect is a message: You are seen, valued, and deserving of dignity."

In South Africa, GBV remains a national crisis of harrowing proportions, with a woman tragically murdered every four hours. Angela's audacious campaign has ignited crucial awareness and mobilised communities nationwide. Her ascent was not merely an act of physical endurance but a living tribute to resilience and the pursuit of justice. Carrying the logos of global brands like Cathay Pacific, GoPro, La Prairie, Zara Wellness, and proudly, the South African flag, Angela dedicated her climb to every South African fighting their own personal mountain. "This is not just my climb; it's every single South African's climb. Together, we can transform Everest into a beacon of hope."

Angela's decision to tackle Everest's North Side was deliberate. It is a route

demanding at least 8,000 metres of climbing experience, where there is no rescue operation in place – a stark reality where "if anything happens, you are alone." Her 50-day climb was an immense mental and physical challenge. "Imagine not showering or being able to wash your hair for almost a month," she smiled, reflecting on the gruelling conditions. She speaks of passing the bodies of fallen climbers, a grim reminder of the mountain's unforgiving nature. "It takes immense strength to continue... You must keep going, it's not a walk. It's survival." Supported by her Sherpa team, there were still moments of doubt, but the sheer will to survive, to avoid dehydration or frostbite, propelled her forward. Angela is now only the second South African, after Cathy O'Dowd 26 years ago, to summit Everest from the North side.

For Angela, the choice of Everest was clear: "Everest is the ultimate goal for any climber... you are on top of the world.

But climbing Everest is nothing compared to what women dealing with GBV face every day. And not just South Africans but worldwide, it's an unthinkable number. Gender-based violence is a very serious issue, and Everest is a seriously challenging climb, and I could think of no better reason to climb it."

Angela's mission extended far beyond the peak. After her successful descent, she and her Sherpa team journeyed deep into the Himalayas, delivering over 100 kilogrammes of donated clothing, shoes, stationery, and books to the Rolwaling Sangag Choling Monastery School and the Mountain Children Home. These remote educational centres, where tradition meets hardship, face immense challenges, often lacking modern academic tools. "This part of the mission is so rewarding," Angela reflected. "Climbing Everest is a symbol of resilience, but giving back – especially to children in these regions – is the real summit." Her foundation aims to bridge this gap, fostering a future where children are equipped for both economic success and the values of compassion and integrity.

This expedition reflects the Impilo Collection Foundation's broader, ambitious mission: to uplift one million lives by 2035 through its three core pillars:

- **Empower Her:** Focused on supporting women affected by GBV.
- **Empower Him:** Aims to help men, particularly addressing issues like suicide.
- **Empower Them:** Dedicated to advocating for education for all.

Angela candidly explains her motivation: "I spoke at the Constitution Hill Human Rights Precinct three years ago about

gender-based violence (GBV) and the shocking statistics in South Africa. Thousands and thousands of women die every year from GBV and we don't even talk about it. I wanted to do more and do something big and challenging that could draw more attention to this cause and help the women affected at the same time, and we decided to collect bras." She highlights that bras, while simple, "give women dignity, they are a health and wellness benefit and assist with mental strength."

As of today, Angela is still 2,000 bras short of her foundation's goal. She is making a heartfelt call to all South Africans to support women affected by gender-based violence and to donate this Women's Month. Once the target of 8,849 bras is reached, they will be displayed across all nine provinces as a powerful showcase of strength and resilience for all women affected by GBV, a reminder that "They are not forgotten." Following this, the bras will be sorted by size, washed, repacked, and distributed to informal settlements and GBV housing.

Looking ahead, Angela's vision for the Impilo Collection Foundation is to go beyond material resources towards true empowerment. "My next step would be to move away from giving out materials, and to look towards helping these women stand alone. Teach them skills that can assist them to open their own business and give them financial independence." This will involve continued fundraising for skills education, inspired by encounters like meeting a woman in Nepal who made bags from banana leaves.

Under the "Empower Him" pillar, Angela also hopes to see more men actively involved in educating South Africans against gender-based violence. "If you are a father, a brother, an uncle... stand up for the women in your life and say no to GBV."

This is a call for collective action. Gender-based violence is a crisis that impacts us all. It's time to recognise that this fight is not for one gender alone, but a shared responsibility that demands collective effort. When men and women stand together, united in purpose, we forge an unstoppable force against violence, inequality, and injustice. By combining our voices, our strengths, and our unwavering commitment, we can challenge harmful norms, support survivors, and build a future where safety, respect, and dignity are universal rights.

Angela Yeung's journey to Everest is a powerful symbol of what can be achieved when personal challenge meets profound purpose. Her dedication, and that of the Impilo Collection Foundation, offers a beacon of hope. Join her mission and contribute to a future where dignity, safety, and empowerment prevail.

Why does a colder than usual winter have such a detrimental effect on your vegetation? And how do you recover from this?

During winter, when temperatures drop to near or below freezing, water vapour in the air can turn into ice crystals on the surfaces of plants. This is called frost. The tops of plants and trees are more exposed to the open sky; therefore, they lose heat faster than the lower parts sheltered by foliage or the ground. This makes the tops colder and more likely to form frost.

Other factors, like clear skies or high humidity, make frost more likely, while

cloud cover or dry air can prevent it. Wind can also influence this. If it's calm, frost forms more easily because cold air settles, and the moisture in the air stays close to the plant. Light winds can mix in more moisture, increasing frost, but strong winds might prevent frost altogether by keeping surfaces warmer and drying them out.

To help your garden recover after a very cold winter, STM Landscaping recommends following these best practices.

Assess damage early:

- Inspect plants for signs of frost damage, such as discoloured, wilted, or brittle leaves and stems.
- Check for split bark or broken branches on trees and shrubs.
- Wait until the threat of frost is over (typically early spring) to evaluate perennial plants, as some may show delayed signs of life.

Prune strategically:

- Remove dead or damaged branches and foliage using clean, sharp

ideal amount of water to be applied during a week in your garden is 25mm. It is recommended to deepwater, i.e. 12.5mm on a Tuesday and the remaining 12.5mm on a Friday. Ask your local garden centre about nozzle sizes to determine how long you should water.

- Water in the morning to allow foliage to dry before cooler evening temperatures.

Protect emerging growth:

- Apply a fresh layer of mulch (5-7cm) around plants to regulate soil temperature and retain moisture, keeping it away from stems to prevent rot.

Fertilise sparingly:

- Apply a balanced, slow-release fertiliser or organic compost once plants show signs of new growth. Avoid high-nitrogen fertilisers early on, as they can promote weak, frost-vulnerable growth.
- For specific plants like roses or fruit trees, use targeted fertilisers suited to their needs.

Note: Before fertiliser is applied, ensure that the soil temperature has increased and remained consistent for about two

pruning tools to prevent disease. For perennials, cut back dead growth to reveal healthy tissue or down to ground level if no signs of life remain.

- Avoid heavy pruning of marginally damaged plants until new growth appears, as this can stress them further.

Clean up debris:

- Clear fallen leaves, broken branches, and other debris to prevent fungal diseases and pest infestations.
- Remove any mulch that may have compacted or frozen solid to allow soil to warm up and breathe.

Test and amend soil:

- Conduct a soil test to check nutrient

levels and pH of the soil, as cold winters can deplete soil nutrients. Add organic matter like compost or well-rotted manure to improve soil structure and fertility during spring when soil temperatures start to increase. The ideal pH range is between 6 and 8.

- Aerate compacted soil to enhance root access to water, air and nutrients.

Water wisely:

- Water plants deeply once the soil thaws, especially if the winter was dry. This rehydrates the roots. Avoid overwatering, as waterlogged soil can harm recovering plants. The

weeks and that water is available to apply directly after fertilisation.

Replant and replace:


- Identify plants that didn't survive and replace them with cold-hardy varieties suited to Gauteng. Your local nursery will be able to guide you towards the correct decision.
- Consider native plants or those with proven winter resilience to reduce future losses.

Support trees and shrubs:

- Some species are more vulnerable, and it is advised to wrap them with crop cover towards the end of May, early June. Do note this for next winter.
- Stake or brace young trees damaged by wind to stabilise them as they recover.
- For shrubs with split bark, clean cuts around wounds and monitor for infection; severely damaged shrubs may need replacement.

Monitor for pests and diseases:

- Cold-stressed plants are more susceptible to pests and diseases. Inspect regularly for signs like discoloured leaves or insect activity and treat promptly with organic or chemical controls as needed.

Plan for future winters:

- In late autumn, apply mulch, wrap sensitive plants, or use burlap screens to protect against future cold snaps.
- Choose planting sites with good drainage and wind protection to minimise winter stress.

Note: Be patient, as some plants like perennials and bulbs may take weeks to show recovery. If you're unsure about specific plants, share details or photos with a local nursery or garden service.




Spring Book Fair

SAVING LIVES

When a two-month-old baby's chest infection suddenly turned serious, his mother remembers the horror of realising her son was not breathing properly and was slipping in and out of consciousness.

"I knew we had to try to keep him awake. He needed urgent medical care, and so I drove with Nkateko on my lap to the emergency department at Netcare Waterfall City Hospital. I don't remember parking the car – I just rushed him inside and they immediately put him on oxygen," recalls Nthabiseng Mlangeni.

At first, Nkateko, whose name means 'Blessing', was admitted to the paediatric unit, and his mother was able to remain with her son, rooming in with him. After several days in the hospital, Nkateko was again struggling to breathe, despite medication and physiotherapy to help clear mucus from his lungs. Doctors transferred Nkateko to the paediatric intensive care unit (PICU) under the care of paediatric intensivist Dr Palesa Monyake.

"In the PICU, they started him on high flow oxygen and Dr Monyake explained the unfamiliar environment to us, the treatment Nkateko was receiving and how they were monitoring his condition every minute. It was the hardest thing to have to leave my two-month-old baby and go home because it's not possible for parents to room in with their children in the high care environment," Nthabiseng recalls.

"I did not sleep at all that night, between worrying about Nkateko and anxiously expecting a call from the hospital at any moment. It was one of many sleepless nights for us in the weeks ahead, but we came to trust the PICU team implicitly."

The next day, Nkateko's vital statistics suddenly dropped further, requiring the baby boy to be placed on a ventilator, then on an oscillator to support his breathing.

"He started to swell up in response to the infection, and it was extremely frightening for us as parents to see all these tubes sticking out of our baby. Our families here in Gauteng and other relatives travelled from different provinces to support us. We knew it was a very serious situation, and we prayed constantly," Nthabiseng says.

Dr Monyake says Nkateko was one of several children admitted to the PICU requiring critical care for respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) so far this year.

"Babies' immune systems have not had the time to build up resistance to the many common germs such as RSV that generally would not cause serious illness among older children or adults," she says.

"It is rare to put a child on ECMO, however, this RSV season has been particularly brutal, and we are grateful this lifesaving option is available for our patients who are in the critical situation that Nkateko faced," she says.

Cardiothoracic surgeon Dr Sharmel Bhika explains that extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO) is a form of life support in which specialised equipment artificially performs the functions of the heart and lungs, giving them a chance to heal. Yet, ECMO is only considered in life-threatening circumstances for such young children.

"ECMO provides a valuable lifeline when other forms of ventilation are no longer proving effective, and without this intervention, Nkateko may not be with us today."

“Nkateko required maximum mechanical ventilatory support and was not reaching targets for adequate oxygenation. ECMO was a clear indication in Nkateko’s case with his rapid deterioration and increased demand on mechanical ventilatory support,” Dr Bhika says.

In extracorporeal life support (ECLS also known as ECMO) blood is pumped outside of the body to a heart-lung machine. The machine removes the carbon dioxide (CO²) from the blood and introduces oxygen (O²) through an artificial lung, or oxygenator, returning the warmed, oxygen-rich blood to the circulation via a vein or, as in Nkateko’s case, via an artery known as veno-arterial ECMO.

“Nkateko was placed on veno-arterial ECMO, so cannulas were surgically placed to drain blood from his internal jugular vein and return oxygenated blood via his carotid artery. This therapy allowed his lungs to rest and recover, while supporting his heart. The ECMO circuit also provides the patient the opportunity to be dialysed effectively so that his fluid balances are managed optimally during this critical time,” Dr Bhika explains.

Nthabiseng says, “At that stage, it seemed like Nkateko was getting worse, and we just wanted him to get better. We needed to decide in extreme circumstances, and we spent an hour asking questions about ECMO, and they explained all the risks, and that he would need a surgical procedure to insert a cannula to connect the system to his heart.

“It was such an anxious time for us, and although I felt like I was at breaking point, we remained hopeful. We also found comfort and support from the nurses and the unit manager Sister Jabulile Nxumalo. Every nurse that looked after Nkateko did it with so much care and they really supported us. The doctors, especially Dr Monyake, were also so supportive and prayed

with us every step of the way. And the ECMO doctors ensured that we were updated throughout the process, while still attending to the families of other children who were also being cared for in the PICU,” Nthabiseng says.

The baby boy showed remarkable resilience as he fought for survival.

“Under the constant care of specially trained PICU nurses, Nkateko gradually improved enough that we could consider transitioning off ECMO after three weeks and back onto conventional ventilation,” Dr Bhika says.

Dr Monyake adds, “This little boy had us so worried, it was an emotional rollercoaster, but his parents were amazing, they remained positive and drew strength from their faith.”

“On Mother’s Day, finally, they could take Nkateko off ECMO. I was nervous, but it was the greatest Mother’s Day gift to know he was making some progress. That day we were so excited that we arrived at the hospital three hours before visiting time – I even managed to eat something for the first time in weeks at the hospital coffee shop,” she says.

“My husband supported me with his positivity throughout. By spending time at our son’s bedside and speaking to him, we felt we were helping to breathe life into Nkateko, telling him ‘We are taking you home soon,’” Nthabiseng says.

At last, Nkateko no longer needed the ventilator, and his relieved parents could hold him in their arms again. “We heard him cry out for the first time in a month and a half, and the tears of relief were streaming down my face; by the Grace of God, he was getting better,” she says.

Nkateko’s father, Tiyani Rivisi, thanked all the specialists, nurses, and allied healthcare practitioners who were part of the team caring for their son at

Netcare Waterfall City Hospital.

“When Nkateko was hospitalised with RSV and required ECMO, our world was turned upside down. But, in the midst of uncertainty, we found strength in each other, my parents, siblings, my in-laws and our faith. My wife and I were each other’s pillars, supporting and praying together,” Tiyani says.

“We feel blessed as a family to have Nkateko back home with us, and he has been doing so well since he was discharged towards the end of May. The outpouring of love and support from our family and in-laws was overwhelming, and we’re grateful for their presence. The medical team’s expertise and care were instrumental in Nkateko’s recovery. This experience taught us that even in darkness, there’s hope. We’re thankful for Nkateko’s resilience and the lessons we’ve learned along the way.”

“He is now five months old, and he’s so active and so hungry, it’s almost like he is making up for lost time,” Nthabiseng concludes.

Types of investment instruments


The main types of investment instruments available to investors are explained below:

Single-manager unit trust funds

In this type of investment instrument, one investment management company selects and manages all the investments in the fund. Consequently, all investment decisions are made by a single team that follows a consistent investment philosophy and specialises in a focused set of asset classes or markets.

Funds of funds

A fund of funds is a diversified portfolio that invests in several other collective investment schemes (also referred to as unit trust funds). Unlike the single-manager unit trust funds approach, exposure to multiple underlying funds offers additional



diversification across different fund management styles. A fund of funds manager can change the relative holdings in the underlying unit trust funds over time in the same way as the single manager can.

Feeder funds

Feeder funds are typically South African investment funds that invest primarily into a single 'master fund'. In the South African context, the master fund will often be an offshore 'parent fund', giving local investors cost-effective access to international markets while investing in rands. A feeder fund instrument offers investors the opportunity to tap into broader market opportunities, providing additional diversification benefits, which aids in managing risk.

Personal Share Portfolios

A Personal Share Portfolio (PSP) is a customised portfolio of directly-owned shares, which are managed specifically for an individual investor, rather than pooled funds like unit trusts. Clients can set up these instruments with the help of suitably qualified and registered advisers.

Model portfolios

A model portfolio is a constructed blend of investments determined by a professional fund manager. Such portfolios typically include collective investment schemes and pooled funds and are designed to match a specific investment approach or benchmark. They are similar to funds of funds in some ways, but they are designed around a specific view of a financial adviser in support of their client's needs and risk profile – a more tailored approach.

Factors to consider when selecting an investment instrument

To select the right instrument, it is important to understand the different ways in which they are constructed. The first factor to consider is your investment goal – what are you trying to achieve? Answering this question will guide you in terms of your need for diversification, the level of risk you can take, the fees you can afford and the time horizon you have available to achieve your goal.

Secondly, consider how much you want to be involved in the various decision-making processes. Often referred to as active and passive management in the context of a specific fund, this concept could also be applied in the choice of the type of instrument. Considering the definitions provided above, it is clear that the various investment instruments have varying levels of involvement in making decisions about market selection and the combinations of investments needed to gain diversification.

The financial industry is tasked with the process of 'Know Your Client', but it is just as important for clients to know themselves. Seeking guidance from a trusted adviser and someone with suitable expertise and experience is key to selecting the right investment instruments that form the basis for your selected product.

As a quick guide, the following main questions should be considered:

1. Your investment goals – would you like to preserve funds and avoid fluctuations, or do you put more value in higher growth or income potential?
2. How much time do you have available to achieve your goal? This is often referred to as the investor's time horizon.
3. How much risk can you withstand, and how much tolerance do you have for market fluctuations? The answers to the three questions above will determine your need for diversification, which is a further guiding factor.
4. What are the fees? It is important to note that different fee structures apply to the various investment instruments. Some fees depend on the value of assets, others on the volume of transactions, and others on the number of parties involved in the investment process. Various tools, including Effective Annual Cost (EAC) statements are available to help investors get a full and transparent view of the fees involved. Ultimately, these fees impact the net returns achieved.
5. What are the tax implications? Taxes may differ depending on the investment instruments you select. A tax practitioner can provide you with more information in this regard.

Investors need to be aware of restrictions applicable to investment instruments:

- There are regulatory limits on asset classes within certain products. For example, if a fund of funds instrument is designed for retirement investments, Regulation 28 limits will apply. Regulation 28 is the section of the Pension Funds Act that limits the level of investment in specific asset classes within a retirement fund.
- Some instruments will require a minimum investment level. This will typically be higher for PSPs.
- Liquidity constraints could result in instruments having lock-in periods.
- Access limitations. For example, certain more sophisticated instruments may carry higher costs and only be viable investment options for high-net-worth individuals or qualified investors.


