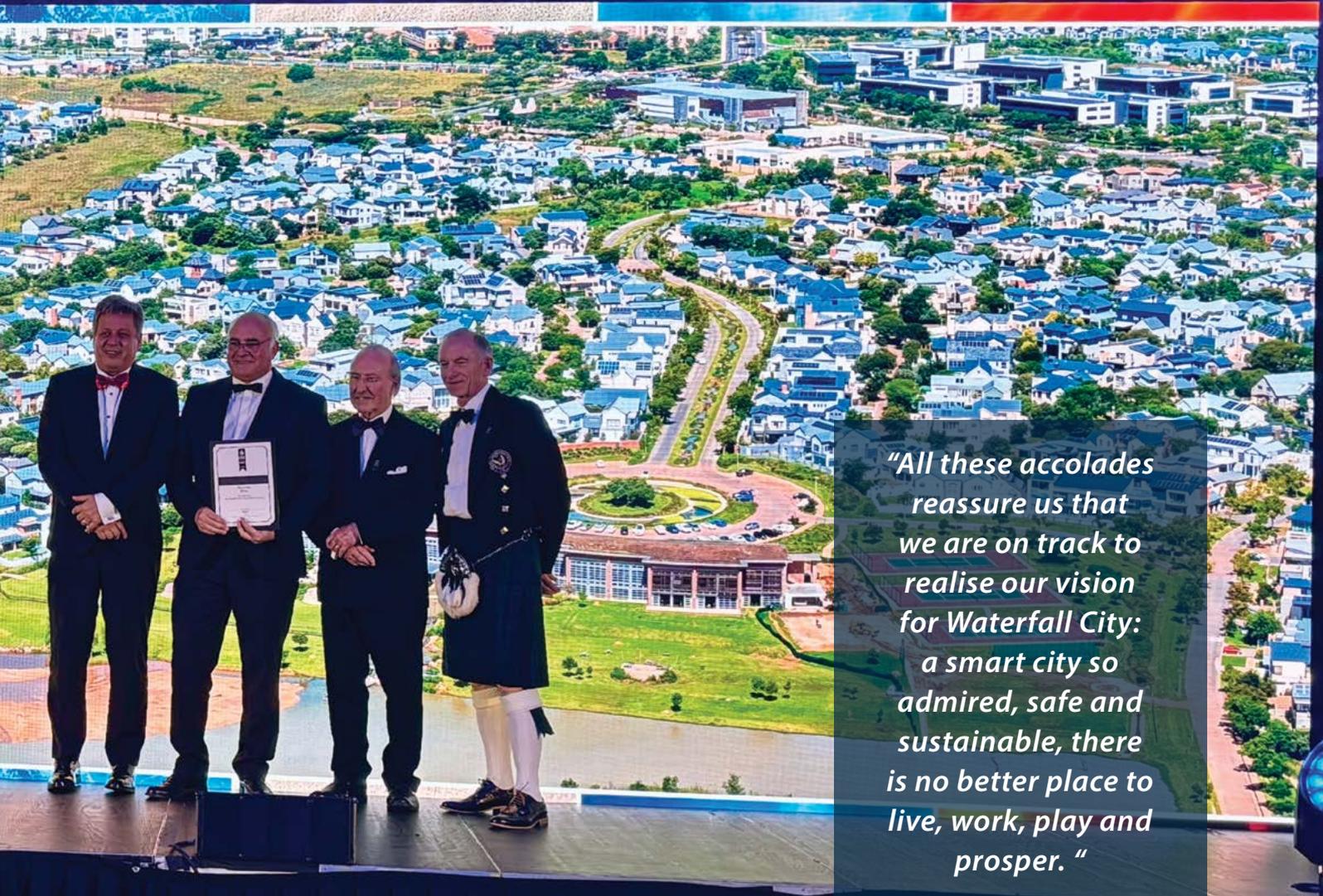

Waterfall City has won the *Best Masterplan South Africa 2025-2026* award from the International

Property Awards - Africa Chapter. The accolade was presented to Waterfall City Management Company (WCMC) at the International Property Awards ceremony held in London on 23 October. This is the second consecutive year that the development has achieved this prestigious title, recognising the pioneering urban design framework successfully guiding the growth of this thriving smart city.

Along with this achievement, Waterfall City received a nomination for the *Best Masterplan Africa* award, a title the development also won earlier this year and was furthermore named as an Award Winner in the *Sustainable Residential Development South Africa 2025-2026* category for the Waterfall Country and Country Village Estates.

What's more, Willie Vos, CEO of WCMC, was honoured with a Special International Property Award for

Willie's imagineering of Waterbucks, the world's first geographically bound smart-city rewards programme, due to launch early next year, cements his reputation as an innovator and change-maker in the property sector.

The Masterplan category was specially created in 2024 by the International Property Awards association for large-scale developments covering a minimum of 20,000m² and including at least five of the following uses: residential, retail, commercial, leisure, cultural, institutional, public service and industrial.

Regional heats are staged for Africa, Arabia, Europe, Canada, Central & South America, the Caribbean, USA, UK and Asia Pacific. The highest scoring, five-star regional winners from each category in Africa will automatically be put forward for re-judging against the five-star winners in the other regions of the world. Following this re-assessment, the 2026 International winners will be identified as the 'World's Best'. These winners will be announced at a glittering awards

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2025 IN REVIEW

Reflecting on an eventful year in our bustling City



As the year draws to a close, we caught up with Willie Vos, CEO of Waterfall City Management Company (WCMC), to get his take on what has been another exciting year of development in our award-winning Waterfall City!

Roadworks ahead

The biggest news of the year must be the long-awaited awarding of the K60 contract by Gautrans, the provincial roads agency. After years of promises and hold-ups, construction is finally set to commence before the end of this year. Look out for more about the K60 in 2026.

Another road construction project about to begin is that of the Simlak Drive extension. Currently running from Waterfall Drive at the Netcare Waterfall City Hospital to just past PwC, Attacq is extending Simlak Drive all the way down to Gate 7 Country Estate South. This will involve the building of another bridge across the Jukskei River, which will result in the linking of Country

Estate north and south with Mall of Africa. This will be a dual carriageway, with a signalled intersection at Gate 7, which will eventually be the location of the entrance to the newly planned River View residential development by Balwin. As part of this construction project, Attacq has also started building the single-carriageway access road to Gate 3 Country Estate north, expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2026.

Attacq has furthermore launched the development of Waterfall City Junction, the piece of land east of the Gautrain bridge and K111. Surrounding road infrastructure will be upgraded to a dual carriageway that will tie in with the K60, which ties in with Allandale – so the entire area will become much more accessible.

Planes, trains and automobiles

Waterfall City offers commuters various modes of public transport including taxis, trains, buses and even helicopters!

Taxi commuters will be happy to hear that a new taxi holding facility is being constructed under the Waterfall City Park bridge, which crosses Simlak Drive just behind Mall of Africa. The two taxi super stops that are currently situated on the eastern and western sides of the mall will be moved and integrated into this new and improved Wi-Fi-enabled, sheltered facility, which will feature meeting rooms, bathrooms and retail stores, guaranteeing a first-class experience for travellers.

To improve traffic circulation and safety, a problematic set of traffic lights on the corner of Woodmead Drive and Waterval Crescent was replaced in January 2025 with an innovative, low-energy and vandal-resistant design. This first-of-its-kind in-SA traffic light is mounted on a 1.9m solid concrete bollard (of which 1m is underground) to prevent road accident damage and theft. While all controls are underground for the same reasons, this low-voltage light also features solar power backup in case of

power outages. Reinforcing Waterfall City's dedication to continuous improvement, the 'always out' traffic lights at the intersection of Allandale Road and the K101 Old Pretoria Road were also replaced with this revolutionary design in September.

To keep traffic flowing safely, even during unexpected outages or loadshedding, 10 more sets of traffic lights across our City were upgraded with back-up power this year, bringing the total to 30 out of 36 intersections now guaranteed to always be on.

Taking to the skies, Waterfall City's Heliport is finally being extended; one can already see the construction when driving past on the K101. While there will only be extra hangar space for 10 more helicopters, the extension will boast cutting edge facilities for the maintenance and overhauling of helicopters from around the world. We are very proud to be home to this very sophisticated, world-class facility, which is the largest of its kind in the

southern hemisphere. Work on the extension should be completed by May 2026.

Safe as houses

Security remains a key focus area, so in the past year, nine additional advanced surveillance cameras, featuring number plate and facial recognition abilities, were installed in the Woodmead area, as part of our Woodmead Retail District Improvement Project. More CCTV cameras will also be introduced on every new road mentioned above.

In addition, all our residential estates are in the process of upgrading their security infrastructure and equipment, be it improving the integrity of their boundary walls or the maintenance of their electric fences, increasing surveillance cameras, upgrading optic fibre or updating software. There is also more integration between the various estates through our centralised risk and security management body.

Along with the construction of

the Simlak Drive extension bridge to Gate 7, there will be some enhancements to stormwater lines and a security upgrade for Waterfall Country Estate at the ingress of the river. The boundary wall will be extended all the way up to the bridge itself, securing that area even further.

Residential news

On the residential front, Galileo – the fourth and final tower of Ellipse Waterfall – was completed, with handover taking place in early November. In Waterfall Country and Village Estates, there are currently 99 houses under

construction, with only 52 vacant stands left. This means we are nearing the end of construction on these estates. Meanwhile, Balwin has launched the next and final phase of The Polofields and is planning to complete that within the next three years. Balwin has furthermore introduced a world-class lifestyle amenity, namely Balwin PADEL Waterfall City. Located just outside the Munya residential development and open to the public, the venue boasts five state-of-the-art indoor courts, a restaurant and coffee bar, as well as a unique centre court with stadium seating – a first in SA. Speaking of padel, Waterfall Country Village Estate also built and unveiled two padel courts next to the clubhouse a few months ago.

In March, WCMC hosted the inaugural WCMC Prestige Property Awards, dedicated to recognising the outstanding contributions of real estate agents operating within Waterfall City. Attended by 53 agents from 27 agencies, the overall winners were Andrew Pearse from Platinum Residential and Sue de Klerk from Jawitz Properties.

Waterfall City Hospitality – our City's official short-term Rental Operator – launched this year to offer secure short-term letting options. Now live at Ellipse Waterfall, this exciting offering is set to expand across more estates in

and around the City soon. And finally, Attacq launched their new 19-storey Aspire luxury apartment tower in June, which is due to break ground in the second half of 2026.

The Commercial sector

In June, Attacq completed the four-storey, 4,400m² Building 3 of The Ingress development in the CBD. The fact that this building was fully pre-let prior to completion reflects the strong demand for premium, sustainable workspaces that support evolving business needs, prioritise employee

wellbeing, and offer long-term value. Attacq has also commenced the construction of Gateway East – a combination of retail and office space. Flanking the existing Gateway West office block, this impressive building will change the face of the entrance to Waterfall City's CBD from Allandale Road, and we are looking forward to its planned completion in a year's time.

Construction also started on the second building of Vantage Data Centers' first phase this year and should be completed in early 2026.

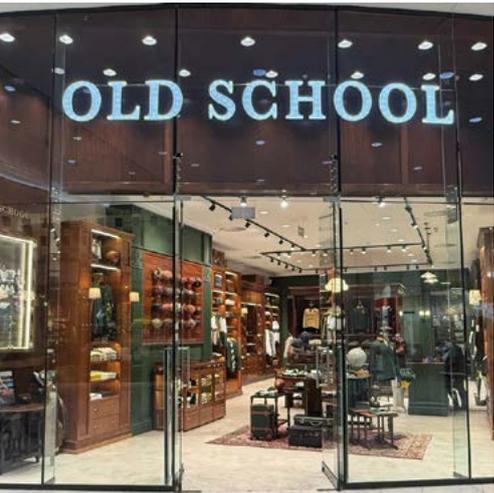
Talking shop

In terms of retail, at Polofields Crossing, a Mica Paint and Hardware has opened, while The Potato Shed Restaurant rebranded and is now The Butcher's Barrel. Foodies will be thrilled to hear that three new restaurants are currently under construction at this centre and are due to open in July next year. At Waterfall Wilds, the arts and crafts centre rebranded to Mud and Muse and is standing by to help you unleash your creativity. More solar has been installed both at Polofields Crossing and Waterfall Wilds, ensuring that customers can keep on shopping even during outages.

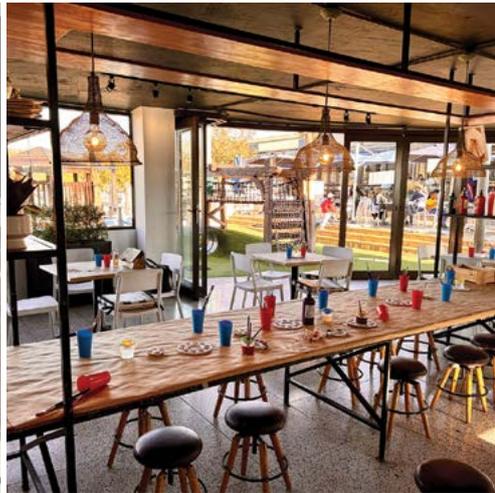

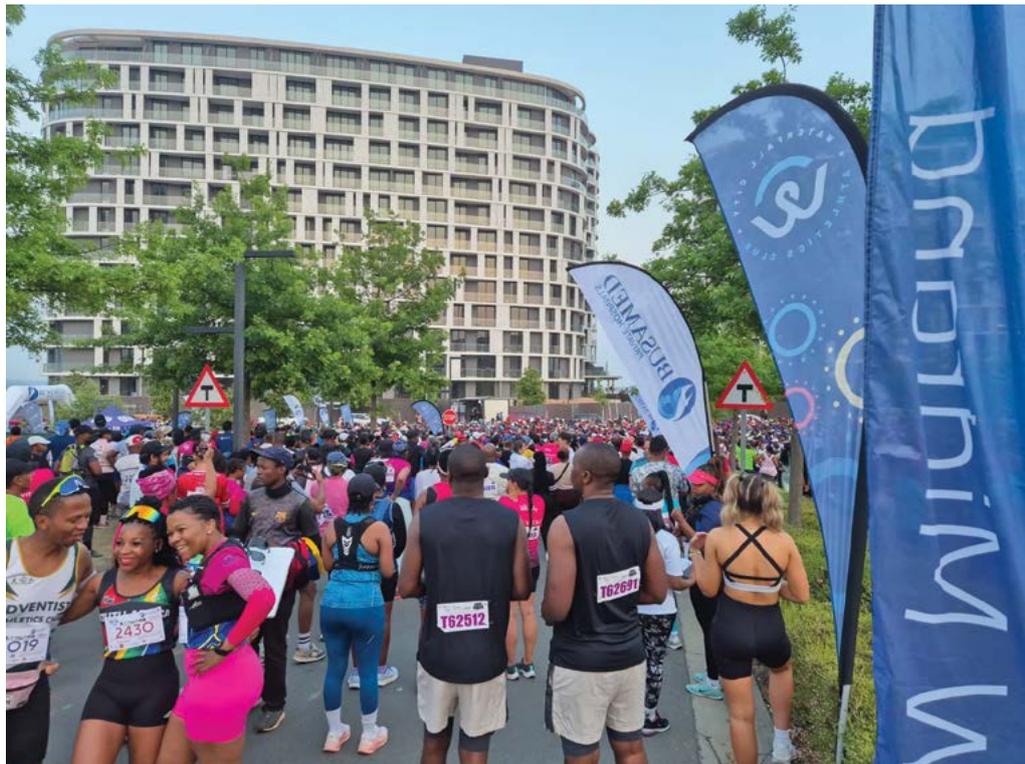

Furthermore, since 2023, it has achieved a compounded annual trading density growth of 11.33%, maintaining a healthy rent-to-turnover ratio of 6.93%.

In October, we saw a record 60 teams take part in our second The Amazing Race Waterfall City, solving clues and navigating to hot spots across the City, while racing against the clock for amazing prizes. What fun! In other news, Waterfall Country Estate started their own junior soccer team this year and Waterfall City now also boasts its own Junior Soccer Club.

Fauna and flora

As shared previously, over the December 2024 holiday season, our antelope family expanded significantly, with the birth of seven baby buck – four Springbuck and three Blesbuck. We are excited to share that more recently, four more Springbuck calves were born. They can be found grazing in the area in front of the Waterfall Valley clubhouse, which you can see from Nostimo’s patio.

In addition, at the end of July, six Nyalas were introduced to the greenbelt, which runs parallel with the M1 on Country Estate north. The two males – one young and one adult, and four females migrated to the banks of the northern slope of the Jukskei River, where they can be found browsing happily off the foliage of the indigenous trees, which abound upstream of the weir and Riverbend Café.

To keep everyone abreast of this news and more, the second digital update to the *Waterfall City Field Guide* is being

All shall be revealed in February 2026.

In May, Mall of Africa received international acclaim after winning a *Visual Victory Award* at the prestigious International Council of Shopping Centres (ICSC) Global Marketing Awards in Las Vegas. The award, which recognises excellence in retail visual merchandising, was presented in the category of Most Creative In-Line Pop-Up Store Design for the SOOK x Tyla activation co-hosted with Spotify Africa and Sony Music Africa.

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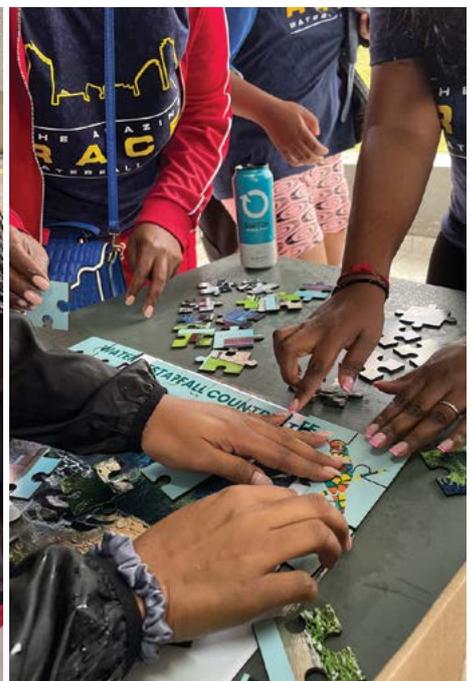
THE AMAZING RACE WATERFALL CITY 2025

A smash hit, as rain fails to dampen spirits

After last year's runaway success, The Amazing Race Waterfall City, powered by Balwin Properties, returned on Saturday, 18 October 2025. It once again transformed the city into a playground of adrenaline, laughter, and pure adventure, uniquely and excitingly bringing the local community together.

This year's edition saw 59 teams of friends, families, and colleagues dive headfirst into the action. Cracking cryptic clues, tackling physical and mental challenges, and racing against the clock through some of Waterfall City's most iconic hotspots. It was a sold out event!" says Chanté van den Berg, Marketing Coordinator, Waterfall City Management Company. "And it really was a major success with a 59 team turnout despite the weather. While we were setting up, the heavens opened and it just poured and poured, but we were pleasantly surprised by the number of teams who actually showed up, and their excitement and commitment were admirable."

Teams had been told to bring extra clothes, raincoats, and umbrellas just in case, but it certainly didn't dampen their spirits. "The rain was no barrier at all; it just added another layer of adventure," says Van den Berg. "The atmosphere at the starting line was filled with hooting, people hanging out of cars, and blaring music. The teams were so committed, all wearing our Amazing Race Waterfall City T-shirts and socks. The rain continued for one and a half hours, but the teams were troopers, and nothing could slow them down."

By 10:30, the rain had stopped, the teams were warmed up, and everything kicked off in high gear! The excitement was next level. The sense of achievement was unmistakable as the teams ran across the finish line, set against a backdrop of more hooting, car radios blaring, and much cheering. The camaraderie was amazing between all teams, with high-fiving, sharing experiences, congratulating each other, and openly discussing their adventures.

As each team crossed the finish line, Fire Ops SA opened the hoses, showcasing a misting spray arch over the participants. Already wet, many of the teams took a minute to dance in the water. As a final hurrah, all participants and the staff walked the finish line together, vibing to music, still wet, but in high spirits.

Hotspots

The real magic of the event happened at the Hotspots – each designed to challenge the participants in unique and entertaining ways. This year, the following locations were included:

Milky Lane at Polofields Crossing, Nostimo restaurant at Waterfall Wilds, Munyaka Lifestyle Estate's lagoon and beach, The Waterfall Country Village Estate clubhouse, Balwin Padel Courts, the soccer field at The Polofields lifestyle estate, the heliport at Ultimate Heli, as well as Olives and Plates restaurant at Ellipse. With nothing but a smartphone app to guide them to the various hotspots, it was a journey



of exploration and fun, uncovering everything this vibrant city has to offer.

Favourites?

“It is so hard to choose, but according to the teams, there were some definite favourites,” says Van den Berg.

At Milky Lane, contestants had to create their own waffle and eat it. The Milky Moo mascots were also there *living* with the teams, and the vibe was definitely popular amongst participants.

The heliport was an entirely different kind of hotspot, and it’s not something you see every day. This is SA’s only privately owned heliport. Activities included spelling words using the official NATO phonetic alphabet and shooting paper aeroplanes into a bucket.

Van den Berg says the *boeresport* at Waterfall Country Village Estate was also a hit, taking the teams back to their childhood with hula hooping and 3-legged races.

And lastly, the car karaoke challenge was a huge success, with teams having to choose a song and record one minute of singing it in the car at any time during the race. The winning team got petrol attendants to sit in their car and sing along with them while the cameraman hung out the sunroof filming! And of course their choice of song helped too, said Van den Berg, being an oldie but goldie, *Sweet Caroline*.

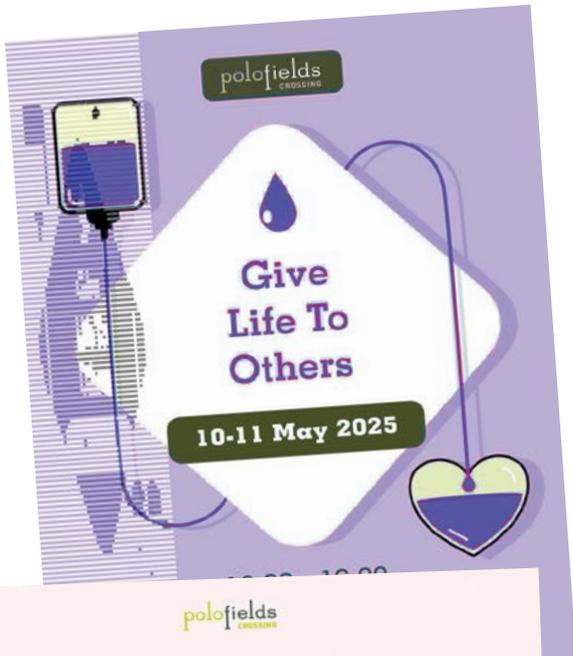
Spring Book Fair

Waterfall City and all its bookworms enjoyed the much-awaited annual spring book fair in September. In a new format, which included six mobile book carts – four at Polofields Crossing and two at Waterfall Wilds – there were hundreds of pre-loved books to choose from. Fun for the kids and the popular Blind Date with a Book also returned. This year's Book Fair raised R27,054 from the sale of 770 books, frames and puzzles. All proceeds went to Greendale House (formerly HospiceWits), to assist in providing quality palliative and hospice care to communities and indigent patients in and around Johannesburg and Soweto.

Blood Drives

Polofields Crossing shopping centre has been hosting monthly blood drives in support of SANBS for a

number of years. One unit of blood can save up to three lives because donated blood is separated into red blood cells, plasma, and platelets – each of which can be given to a different patient. Every 48 seconds, someone in South Africa needs blood and every donation could save a life.

Thank you to all the donors who gave so selflessly of their lifeblood and participated in the Waterfall City blood drives. Between January and October 2025, 254 units of blood were collected, which means up to 762 units were transfused to recipients needing blood. UNDERSTANDING PROSTATE CANCER

in high-risk groups

Black men are at higher risk for prostate cancer and have more reason to test.

After skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer among men. Yet locally, not enough men of African descent – who are at higher risk for the disease – are regularly screening to catch the disease early and take advantage of the treatments available.

“International research indicates that black African men are 60% more likely to develop prostate cancer than other racial groups. There are different types of prostate cancer, and the majority are completely silent – when advanced symptoms like swollen lymph nodes, leg weakness and weight loss are noticed, it may be too late for curative

treatment,” says Dr Steven Cornish, a urologist practising at Netcare Sunninghill Hospital.

“We need greater awareness that prostate cancer does not have to be life-threatening when men know their risk factors and make screening part of their healthcare routine. Considering where the prostate gland is located, men would not usually notice if prostate problems were developing. This is why blood tests, called prostate-specific antigen (PSA) tests, and a digital rectal examination by a doctor are needed.”



“This simple test takes just a moment and may be lifesaving. In South Africa we are still trying to build solid national statistics on prostate cancer, however, there still seems to be a noticeable taboo surrounding this vital men’s health priority.

“To improve prostate cancer outcomes across all communities, we need men to have open conversations with their doctors about screening, particularly black men, as their incidence of prostate cancer internationally is higher than for other population groups.”

PSA levels can point to a number of prostate-related issues, including an enlarged prostate, which is a normal part of ageing, infection of the prostate or prostate cancer.

“Higher PSA levels simply mean there

is something worth investigating with your doctor, it does not necessarily mean prostate cancer is present. Even if there is a need for a small biopsy, and the results lead to a diagnosis of prostate cancer, there is no need to panic. These days, prostate cancer is usually highly treatable if it is picked up earlier,” Dr Cornish explains.

Men with a family history of prostate cancer in male blood relatives or breast or ovarian cancer in female relatives have an increased genetic risk of developing prostate cancer, and they would require earlier or more frequent screening.

It is recommended that all men be screened for prostate cancer at age 45; however, black men and those with a close family history, which includes a parent or sibling, should start earlier at age 40.

“Men should continue to screen, either annually or every five years, depending on individual risk factors and previous PSA results, until they are in their anticipated last 10 years of life. Sometimes, prostate cancer may not even require treatment, and an approach of ‘active surveillance’ is used because prostate cancer usually does not progress as quickly as lung or liver cancer, for example. This means that if you are diagnosed, you do have time to think about your options and ask questions – you have the right to be informed about your health status,” he says.

“The need for regular screening starting in a man’s 40s is tied to the observation that prostate cancer appears to be occurring earlier in succeeding generations. Also, the small percentage of prostate cancers that are more aggressive are often detected in younger men,” warns Dr Cornish.

“As men, we never know when this common male cancer could strike us, but we can be prepared for better outcomes by making screening part of our health routine and by helping to protect our loved ones by having these important conversations with the men in our families.”

And it's not just about handling the immediate financial stresses, but also the future stresses. Whether it's unexpected medical bills or retirement, your ability to gain financial independence depends on the reserves you start building today.

Start with the basics, as early as possible

There is a massive difference between starting to save at 25 versus 35. Even if nothing else changes – how aggressively you save or how your investments perform – starting

10 years earlier can double your retirement savings, thanks to the power of compound interest.

Compounding allows the money you save to start generating returns of its own. The sooner you start, the more time your savings have to grow, which means easing the financial pressure later in life. Delaying saving until you're older often means you'll need to put away much more to reach the same goals, and by then, you may not have the resources or energy to do so.

This is the hard reality that many South Africans face. The question to ask is whether it's easier to reduce spending now when you're young or when you're old and more vulnerable? Unfortunately, one can't have it both ways. You can't spend money indiscriminately in your younger years and still expect to live well when you're older.

Be consistent, no matter how small

Another key question people ask is how much they need to save. My advice is to start small but be consistent. Sporadic saving – whether it's once a year when you receive a bonus or only when you remember – doesn't build the discipline or financial habits you need to gain financial independence.

Think of it like a diet. Crash diets might work temporarily, but sustainable lifestyle changes are more effective in the long term. The same applies to saving. Building it into your monthly routine, through something as simple as a debit order, turns saving into a habit rather than an afterthought.

From a behavioural finance perspective, a 2022 study by the University of Cape Town found that automated savings, such as scheduled debit orders, significantly improve the probability of success. Making regular contributions also helps to reduce the impact of investment volatility, a



strategy known as rand-cost averaging. This means that over time, this approach lowers the risk of investing only when markets are high.

Control equals empowerment

Many people feel overwhelmed by their financial situation, but taking control – even in a small way – is an empowering step. When you start saving, you shift your mindset from surviving to planning. That shift opens doors. Suddenly, it's not just about making it through the month. It's about funding education, starting a side business, or breaking the cycle of debt.

And speaking of debt, it's the exact opposite of saving. Where savings

generate compound interest for you, debt creates compound interest against you. The longer you carry it, the more expensive it becomes. Prioritising savings means moving from paying the bank to paying yourself first.

We live in a world filled with temptation. It's easy to justify a new car or a spontaneous holiday. But every spending decision has an opportunity cost. That R500,000 spent on a car today could be worth R1 million in seven years or even R20 million in 40 years if invested wisely. It's a simple question: what will bring you more fulfilment – a short-term indulgence, or long-term security?



Establishing a goal – whether it's buying a home, funding your children's education, or retiring comfortably – helps anchor your savings behaviour. When you're clear on what you're working towards, it becomes easier to say no to unnecessary expenses.

Set up a system that works for you

The good news is that our financial services industry makes disciplined saving easy. Setting up a debit order aligned to your affordability is a powerful first step. You don't have to start big – you just have to start. Then stick to it.

Picture yourself 20 years from now. Will you be grateful that you tightened your belt and made those small sacrifices when you did, or regret not doing so when you had the chance? The answer usually speaks for itself. And the sooner you start, the less effort it takes. That's the real power of saving and financial empowerment.

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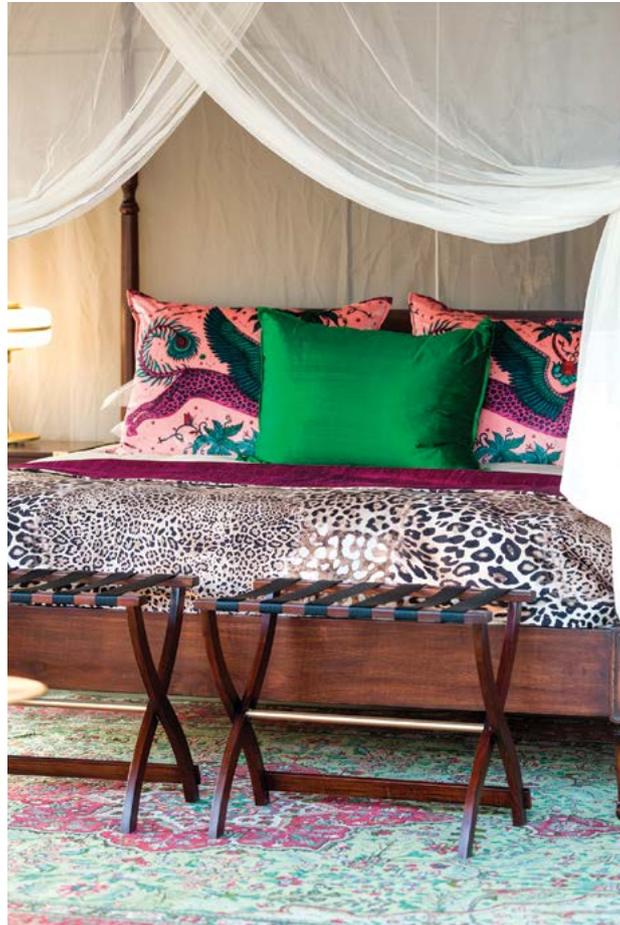
LET'S TALK COLOUR

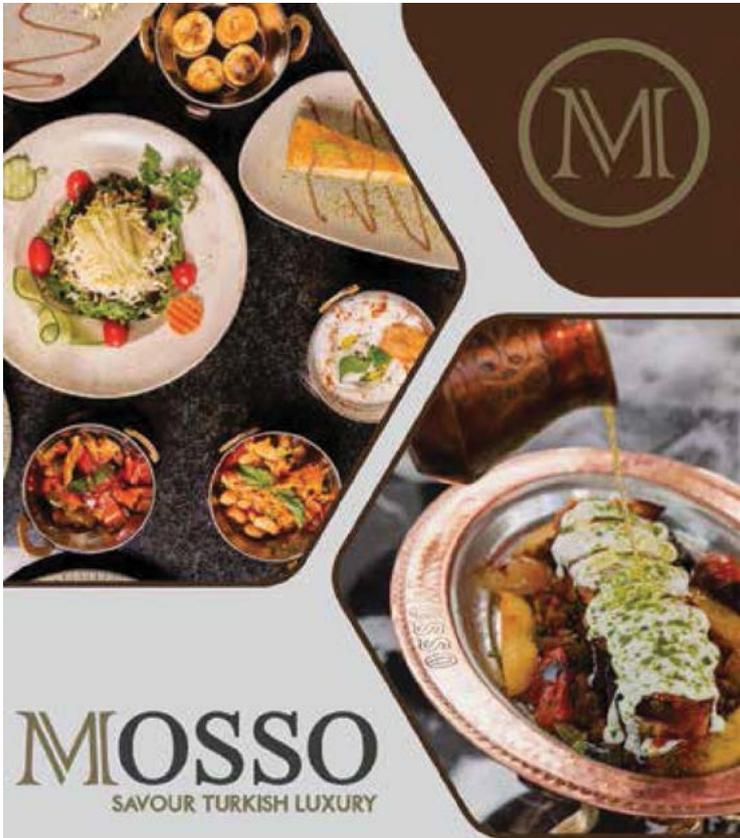
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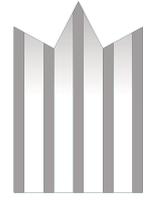
